



## PARKING REGULATIONS

All parking on Port San Luis Harbor District property is regulated by the Harbor Commission of the Port San Luis Harbor District, as set forth in the Port San Luis Harbor District Code of Ordinances (June 2003), and specifically but not exclusively §§ 1.100, 1.110 B, 1.400, 1.410, 1.420, 1.720, 4.100, 8.110, 8.120, 18.130, 20.010 – 20.600 and 22.010 – 22.300.

These regulations are further clarified by the maps attached herewith, as approved by the Harbor Commission on February 27, 2007. Exceptions to these parking regulations may be made in writing by the Harbor Manager or his/her duly appointed representative.

These regulations may be briefly summarized as follows:

- Parking is allowed in designated spaces only. Restrictions on times, uses and types of vehicles may apply.
- Vehicles must obey all posted parking signage.
- No parking is allowed in fire lanes or against red curbs.
- Parking in 'handicapped' designated blue spaces requires display of a 'Disabled Person' placard.
- Camping requires display of a valid camping Permit issued by the District.
- Certain areas are reserved solely for vehicles towing boat trailers.
- Certain areas are designated for camping, which is allowed only in those areas.
- Certain areas are designated for District vehicles only.
- Yellow loading zones are for active loading and unloading only.
- Certain loading zones are for the active loading and unloading of vessels only.
- Vehicles not in compliance with District regulations may be cited and towed.
- Specific locations, types and uses of parking may change depending on the operational and maintenance needs of the District.

The above list is not intended to be exhaustive or complete; refer to the attached maps, the District Code of Ordinances and the California Vehicle Code (incorporated by reference) for further detail.

## PARKING REGULATIONS HARFORD LANDING

October 1, 2010

Pursuant to Port San Luis Harbor District Resolution 07-02, the following clarifications and exceptions are made to the written Parking Regulations, adopted February 27, 2007, and amended by Ordinance by the Board of Commissioners on June 23, 2009:

The purpose of the following is to ensure the availability for the jetty area for use by the general public, unless otherwise reserved for a special event or other purpose:

- 1 No parking or camping on the jetty adjacent to the trailer boat launch area

The purpose of the following is to ensure the availability of parking for vehicles towing trailer boats actively involved in marine activities, while ensuring the safe enjoyment of District facilities by all users:

- 2 If space is available, camping is permitted in Spaces 1 – 14 of the Coastal Gateway parking lot under the following conditions:
  - a) Campers must be towing a trailer with a boat
  - b) Boat must be currently registered and displaying a CF number
  - c) Camping is limited to a maximum of three consecutive nights; vehicle, trailer and boat must completely vacate the space. Camper may relocate to any other available area within the port exclusive of Coastal Gateway spaces 1-14
  - d) Camping is single space, with no utilities
  - e) Camping fee is as established in Code of Ordinances Chapter 4.500 for other 'dry' camping
- 3 If use of spaces 15 - 32 in the Coastal Gateway is, due to high demand, restricted to vehicles pulling trailers with boats, as described in Paragraph 2 above, then the same restrictions for camping overnight in spaces 15 - 32 shall apply with the exception that utilities for camping may be available, in which case the camping fee shall be as established in Code of Ordinances Chapter 4.500 for Coastal Gateway camping.
- 4 Vehicles with attached boat trailers may line up for early launching at the sport launch, beginning at 10:00 p.m., provided that the vehicle and trailer are at all times accompanied by a driver, and remain in a condition suitable to be moved immediately on request by District Harbor Patrol or Security.
- 5 Certain parking spaces may at certain times be designated by signage for vehicles towing boat trailers only. At all other times, and unless

otherwise designated, all spaces in the Harford Landing parking lot are for general parking.

- 6 Vehicles towing trailer boats and parked on District property may be required to display evidence of boating activity (e.g. launch receipts).

The purpose of the following is to ensure that patrons staying at Port San Luis use and pay for camping facilities:

- 7 Vehicles lining up for early launch for more than two consecutive days may be required to purchase and display a valid District camping permit.

The purpose of the following is to ensure that the District proactively manages the limited parking for the greater benefit of all patrons and visitors:

- 8 During times of peak demand, District staff may direct certain users to use certain specific locations within the District.
